What should I already know?

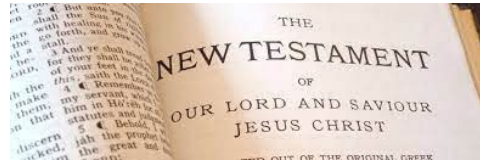
Religious Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • religion refers to people's faith • describes different ways of worship • enquires about how beliefs shape lives and behaviours.
