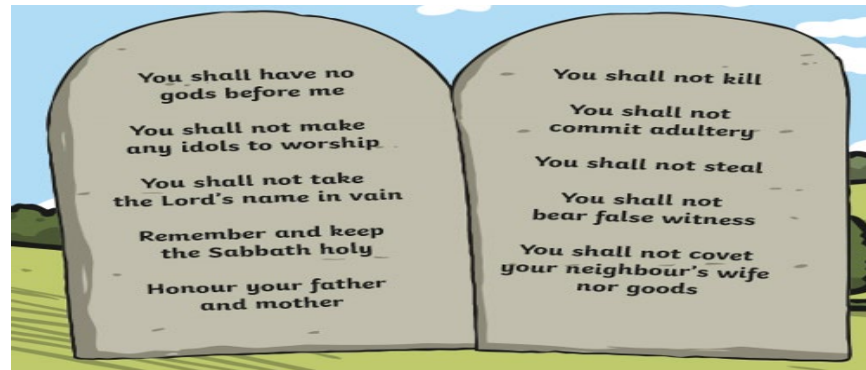
Powerful knowledge

The Bible is a Christian holy book that records Jesus' teachings and shows Christians how to live.

It contains the **Decalogue (Ten Commandments)**
- God's laws on how to behave

The Torah is a Jewish holy book contains the **Ten Commandments**, along with other religious principles or rules.
