Keeping children safe / Safeguarding

At Oasis Academy Fir Vale we want all our children to be safe and happy.

We are committed to working in partnership with all our families. If we are worried about the health, well being or safety of a child we **always** put the **needs of the child first**. We have a **legal duty** to take action. This might mean talking to a family, contacting MAST or making a referral to Social Care. We only make a referral to social care if we are very worried a child is at risk of harm. This could be because a child is not being kept safe at home, for example, a young child playing outside on their own. This might be because a child's needs are not being met, for example, the child does not have enough food or clothes. This might be because a child has a serious injury from home and it is not clear how this happened. This might be because a child has told us that someone is hurting them at home. Any contact with social care is to get help for the child and the family.
