Sodexo Meal Prices

From September 2023, meal prices are increasing to £2.40 per day. This is still below the national average and provide value for money. Please ensure you pay in advance at the office with a card. Weekly payments can be made at £12.00. Please pay your fees on time to avoid a build up of debt.

Cashless Academy

A reminder that we are a cashless academy and payments for all items need to be made with a card. This is uniform, trips, dinner money and penalties. You can make payments over the phone if you have your card present.

Attendance

This year we launched the Attendance Rewards as an incentive for all children to attend school every day, on time. We are planning the same for next year so please help your child come to school every day school is open. There are 190 days of school so that leaves 166 days for appointments and holidays.

Uniform

Children must only wear uniform when at school. You can buy uniform from the school office and we have regular sales at reduced prices. You can also purchase non logo uniform from supermarkets and high street shops. We use Pinders Schoolwear for our uniform. Please refer to our policy on our website.

School timings

Gates are open at 8.40am and close at 8.50am. Late arrivals will be given an unauthorised absence mark. Home time starts at 3.10pm. Persistent late collection will be logged and reported.

Parking

A reminder to parents and carers that there is limited parking in the surrounding area and to park mindfully, not to block anyone. There are traffic wardens patrolling periodically and the school bears no responsibility.

Medical and Allergies

If your child has a medical condition and/or requires medication, it is imperative you notify the school. The same applies for any allergies. Any questions, please call the office on 0114 201 2300 and ask to speak to Mrs Beevor. We are a nut-free school. Packed lunches should be nut-free.
