Our smallest steps become our greatest success


It has been great to see the children enjoying their learning this half term. We are really proud of the fund raising that the children have taken part in for the Pakistan floods appeal.



Children in Need 2022


On Friday 18th November we will be helping to raise money for children in need. We will have a raffle selling badges, notebooks and more.
