

# Flu Immunisations are coming to school on Wednesday 30th November.

The children's nasal spray flu vaccine is safe and effective. It's offered every year to children to help protect them against flu.

The nasal spray flu vaccine is free on the NHS for all primary school children (reception to year 6).

The vaccine is given as a spray squirted up each nostril. It's quick and painless. The nasal spray flu vaccine gives children the best protection against flu. It may take around 2 weeks for the flu vaccine to work. Any children who catch flu after vaccination are less likely to be seriously ill or be admitted to hospital.

If you have already signed the consent form, there is nothing else for you to do. There is still time to sign a consent form. Come to the main office to complete one.
